 - Section 6 drainage is one pipe that drains into Hollister ditch
 - Buyout of 3407 Hollister (filed with FEMA-still pending) and 3405 (later if they choose to sell)
- **Advocacy-Attend meetings and events and take notes to share with neighborhood**
 - PIP Meetings with HPD (3rd Tuesday of each month)
 - Spring Branch Super Neighborhood Meetings (1st Thursday of each month)
 - Harris County-Precinct 4-Lesley Briones (and Pct.3-Tom Ramsey) (when announced)

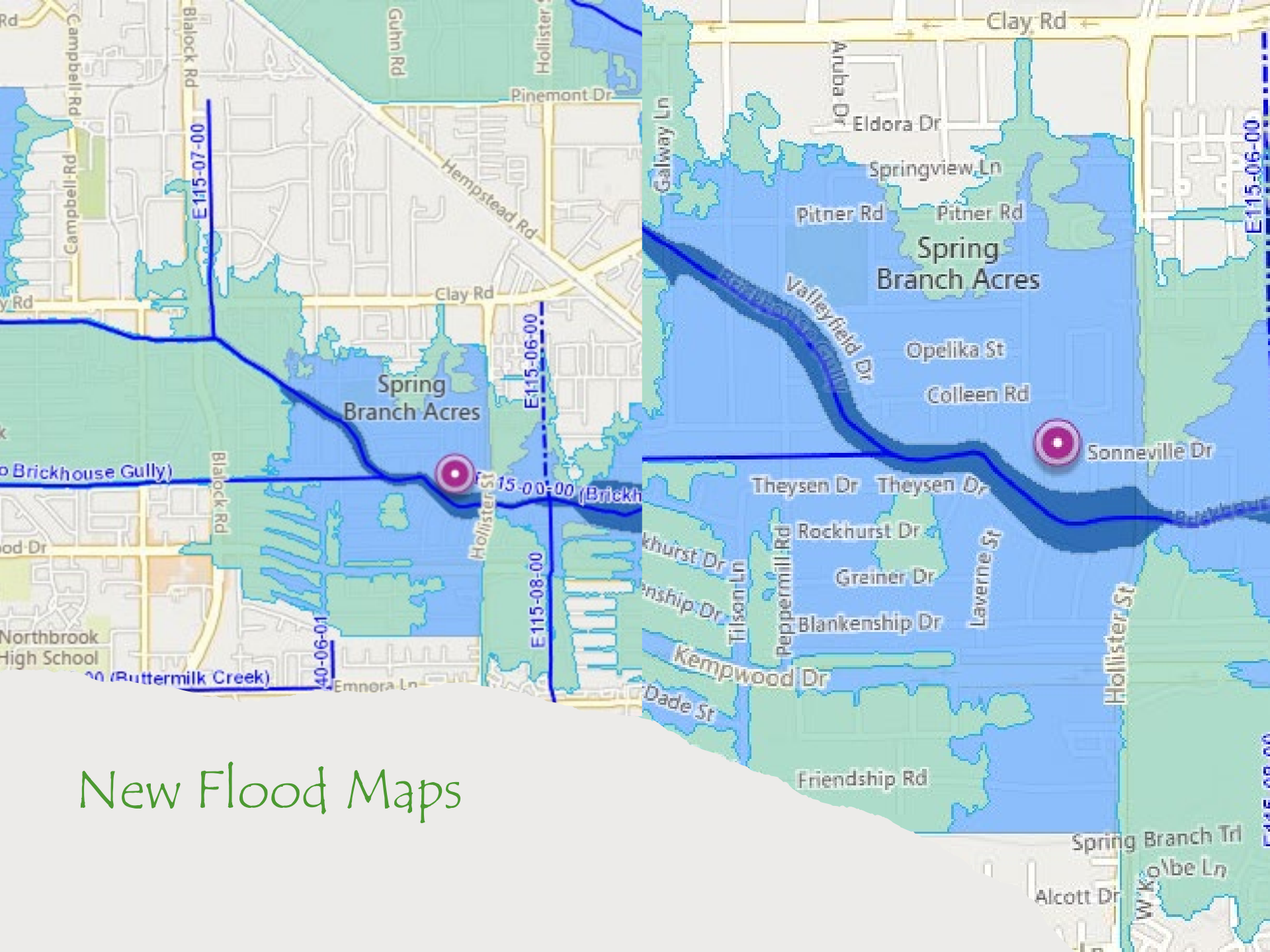

- If you want to become more involved and you care about our Neighborhood and want to make a difference, please consider serving as an officer or Board Member of the Association.
- We also need a new Treasurer.

Directors-Duties

- The Board leads the direction of the Civic Association.
- Board Members are asked to provide their best advice regarding issues that come before the Board and determine the action to be taken by the Officers.
- Board Members discuss everything that's going on in the neighborhood so have a lot of responsibility as well as a duty of confidentiality.
- All Board Members and Officers are covered by D&O Insurance for any actions they take. We also have a General Liability policy for all of our events so everyone is protected.
- There are 3 Board Members and 2 Officers (President and VP) that make up the 5-member Board.
- Board Members are asked to serve a 3-year term but can resign at any time for any reason. The rest of the Board then votes on a replacement.
- President presides over Board Meetings and provides a draft Agenda before each meeting so we stay organized.
- A quorum consists of a majority of the Directors (3 out of a total of 5) to approve projects or spending any BCA funds.
- We meet once per month at local restaurants around the area which are easy to get to except for a month or two over the summer. We also use Teams in case you can't attend in person.
- Board Meetings occur on the second Wednesday of the month at 6:30 pm. Any Board Member may raise an issue and call for a vote or discussion.

Directors-Qualifications

Directors

- Number: Not less than three nor more than nine-currently 3, need 5
- Must be a Member in good standing
- Must be at least 18 years of age
- Must agree to attend five (5) meetings per year-in person or by phone
- Must agree to serve one three (3) year term from January 1
- Staggered terms so one director rolls off each year
- May serve one consecutive term of three (3) years (a total of 6 years)

Officers

Treasurer

(a) The Treasurer shall maintain accurate books of account for all receipts and disbursements of the Association.

(b) The Treasurer shall establish bank accounts and receive and deposit all monies of the Association in a...financial institution.

(c) The Treasurer shall maintain a file of vouchers and supporting documents...

(d) The Treasurer shall conduct the financial affairs of the Association as directed and authorized by the Members, shall maintain current and accurate records of payment of Membership Fees, and coordinate membership status with the Secretary and/or Chair of the Membership Committee.

(e) The Treasurer shall arrange for the payment of all Board-approved expendituresAll expenditures exceeding Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) must be approved in writing by any three (3) Officers.

- (g) The Treasurer shall create a report of the Association's finances and present a report of finances at Member meetings...
-
- (i) The Treasurer shall propose an annual budget itemizing revenues and expenses and statement of income for the next fiscal year during the last quarter of the calendar year...
- (j) The Treasurer shall maintain the Association's Section 501(c)(4) tax exempt status by the annual filing of Form 990 with the Internal Revenue Service.

New Heavy Trash Policy-What was it?

- On-Demand Scheduling: Instead of set monthly schedules, you must call 311 or use the 311 app on your phone to schedule a collection.
- Pick-up Window: Once requested, the City will confirm an appointment, and the pickup will be completed within five (5) working days.
- Limitations: Each residential address is allowed a maximum of four (4) heavy trash/tree waste pickups per calendar year.
- Volume Restriction: There is a limit of 8 cubic yards (roughly the size of a small minivan) of heavy trash per pickup.
- Purpose: The change aims to stop crews from driving to houses with no trash, which previously caused weeks of delays.

New Heavy Trash Policy Bites the Dust!

- The City received so many complaints, plus the fact that they cannot honor the five-day window they had promised, they have suspended the change to heavy trash pickup.
- I met with our Councilmember, Amy Peck, last Thursday and she said that we are still delayed.
- The reason they gave us is that we are scheduled for the 4th Thursday which is at the end of each month.
- Because they get so far behind, they then skip over us and re-start pickups to those who are scheduled for the first two weeks of the month! I let the Councilmember know that this is completely unacceptable and I relayed my concerns to the Mayor as well.

Solid Waste Management Department Spring Holiday Collection and Facility Schedule

HOUSTON — The City of Houston Solid Waste Management Department (SWMD) announces an adjusted curbside collection schedule in observance of the Spring Holiday. Curbside services and facility operations will follow the schedule outlined below.

Residents with a regular Friday collection day will have their trash and recycling collected on **Saturday, April 4**.

No other collection days are affected. All other residents should place their containers out on their regularly scheduled collection day.

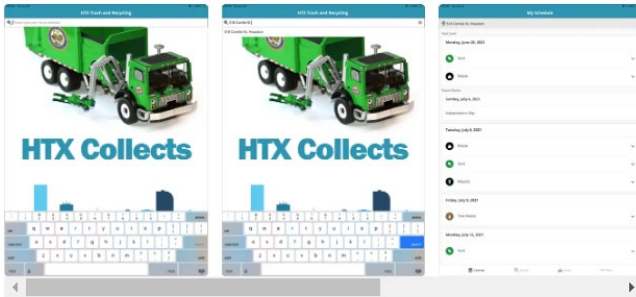

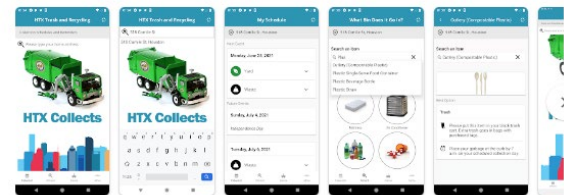
